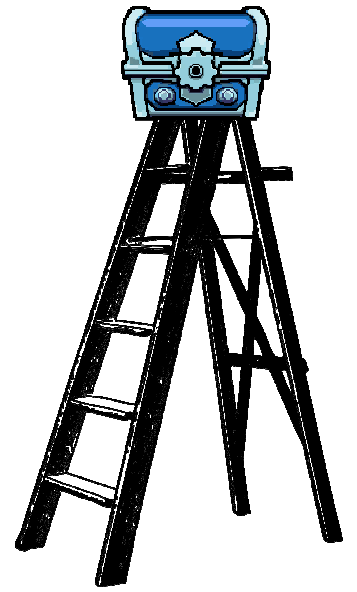

OUR COMMUNITY HALL A LEGACY TO TREASURE

The Community Hall:

The Columbia City Community Hall is a popular multi-purpose venue that is used by citizens, groups, organizations and businesses for a wide range of purposes and community events. It is an affordable venue that is available to rent by the hour or day. The building also serves as a designated emergency shelter under an existing agreement with the American Red Cross. With a maximum capacity of 334 persons, the single unisex restroom facility is sorely inadequate, and the kitchen is in dire need of refurbishment.

About the Renovation:

This project involves remodeling the kitchen, eliminating the single restroom, creating separate men and women restrooms, adding a shower facility, providing easily accessible storage for tables and chairs, installing retractable basketball hoops, upgrading the windows, and making other necessary repairs and ADA accessibility improvements. This project is essential to the preservation and sustainability of the Community Hall building, and it will increase the use and interest in this already popular facility by enhancing the overall rental experience. With these renovations, this affordable multi-purpose facility will meet the needs of many more people in the community and surrounding area.

Project Budget and Funding:

This project is estimated to cost \$194,960.00. Project funding will come from a combination of funds raised from sponsors, donors and partners, contributions of goods and services, foundation grant awards, City funds and in-kind contributions.
