SHOP WITH A COP NOMINATIONS

SEWER PROJECT PROGRESSES TO NORTHWEST AREA OF CITY

Starting in November, 16 steel septic tanks will be abandoned or replaced, 1,100 feet of sewer lateral will be replaced, and 2,000 feet of 4-inch sewer line will be upsized to 6-inch line. The specific project area involves those portions of Park and Sixth Streets between Pacific and Lincoln Streets. The steel tanks have exceeded their useful life, and the area will begin to be converted to gravity flow. The contractor will attempt to make contact with the residents of property that will be directly impacted by the work. Residents are encouraged to watch for door hangers that may provide them with important information about the project.

In October, twenty-four sewer manholes in the southwest area of the City were lined with an epoxy type grout to reduce groundwater flow into the sewer system, commonly referred to as infiltration. Infiltration increases energy and sewer treatment costs and reduces system capacity. Infiltration occurs through holes, cracks, joint failures, and faulty connections.

COLUMBIA CITY PROPERTY TAXES SUPPORT POLICE SERVICES


Property taxes are one of Columbia City's largest revenue sources, equal to 38% of the anticipated General Fund revenues this year. Columbia City uses the property tax revenue it collects to provide police protection services to the community.


This year 12% of the amount you pay to the Columbia County Assessor for property taxes is representative of the taxes Columbia City levies. Columbia City

levies two separate taxes - a permanent tax levy of \$1.1346 per \$1000 assessed value, and a local option levy in the amount of \$0.67 per \$1000. The City of Columbia City tax listed on your 2015-16 tax statement from the County Assessor equates to the combination of these two tax levies with a total combined rate of \$1.8046 per thousand.

89% of the amount you pay to the Columbia County Assessor supports other governmental agencies, such as the St. Helens School District, Columbia River Fire & Rescue, and Columbia County.

OPEN BURNING NOVEMBER 7TH - 22ND BURN PERMIT REQUIRED

Yard debris may be burned outdoors beginning Saturday, November 7th, and ending Sunday, November 22nd. Burning is restricted to <u>yard debris only</u>, and burn barrels are prohibited. Yard debris is lawn clippings, leaves, brush, trimmings/prunings, sawdust and wood scraps. It is **not** dirt/gravel, paper/plastic, metal, rocks/bricks, sod, or food waste.

Burn permits are required prior to burning! Permits may be obtained at City Hall, at any Fire Station within the Columbia River Fire & Rescue District, or on their website: www.CRFR.com. Please remember you will also need to call the "Burn Line" at (503) 397-4800 each day to see if it is a burn day.

CODE ENFORCEMENT REMINDERS

Sidewalks: The owner of property abutting a sidewalk is responsible for keeping the sidewalk free of yard debris, snow, ice, and other obstructions.

Curfew: Curfew is in effect between 10:30 pm and 4 am Sunday through Thursday, and between midnight and 4 am Friday and Saturday.

RV Waste Disposal is Prohibited: It is unlawful to dump RV waste into the City's sewer system. RV waste must be disposed of at a specifically designated disposal site.

CHRISTMAS SHIPS

The Christmas Ships will visit Columbia City on Saturday, December 12, 2015. At 6 pm they will assemble at the St. Helens City Docks and head downriver to Columbia City. If weather conditions permit, they will cross to the Washington side of the river and pass by the Columbia Riverfront RV Park, and then pass by Columbia City again on their return trip to St. Helens. The fleet will be out for approximately two hours.
