### OREGON STATE POLICE (OSP) NON-EMERGENCY MOBILE NUMBER

People on the road can call Oregon State Police about nonemergency issues like reporting minor crashes, highway hazards and requests for assistance outside local City jurisdictions.

Mobile phone users can dial **\*677** for a mobile phone-direct call to the Oregon State Police dispatch center. It is answered by a live dispatcher around the clock, seven days a week, but is separate from the 911 emergency system.

### ADU & CORNER LOT DUPLEX DEVELOPMENT CODE AMENDMENTS PROPOSED

On March 19, 2019 the Planning Commission unanimously voted to recommend to the City Council proposed amendments to the Columbia City Development Code related to Chapter 7.112 Accessory Dwelling Units and Chapters 7.45 and 7.50 (R-2 and R-3) zones.

The purpose of the code amendments is to 1) ensure accessory dwelling unit regulations are consistent with recent state law changes to promote affordable housing options and 2) add design standards to ensure duplex development on corner lots are consistent with the single family character in Columbia City.

The City Council will do a first reading of the ordinance on Thursday, April 4, 2019 and a second reading will occur on Thursday, April 18, 2019. Both meetings will start at 6:00 p.m.

Interested persons are invited to submit written testimony prior to any of the meetings or in person at the meetings. Comments submitted in regard to these matters should be directed toward applicable sections of Title 7 of the Columbia City Development Code. 7.160.060 (Procedures for Decision Making: Legislative).

The proposed amendments and all related documents will be available for review at City Hall located at 1840 Second Street, Columbia City, Oregon. Copies can also be purchased for a fee.

### **SPRING CLEANUP - APRIL 13TH**

Now is the time to get rid of that unwanted junk old appliances, scrap metal, yard debris, old furniture, newspaper, unwanted items, etc. The annual Spring Cleanup Day will be held on **Saturday, April 13<sup>th</sup>, 2019, from 8 am to noon** at the Columbia City School. Extra bulky waste or hard-to-dispose-of items, such as old furniture or mattresses, more than two loads of yard debris, lawn mowers, etc. will be accepted for a fee. The following minimum charges apply to other items:

Yard debris, trees and limbs First two loads FREE - \$5.00 per load after two Car load - \$5.00 / Pick-up load - \$10.00 Trailer load - \$15.00 Refrigerators/freezers/air conditioners - \$10.00 Other appliances - \$5.00

### Car batteries FREE Car or truck tires - \$2.00/ea Commercial truck tires - \$4.00/ea

<u>NO</u> tires on rims, <u>NO</u> commercial truck loads, <u>NO</u> wet garbage, <u>NO</u> burn piles, <u>NO</u> painted wood, <u>NO</u> lumber, <u>NO</u> construction debris, <u>NO</u> sod

Also Habitat for Humanity ReStore will be onsite to accept gently used residential building materials, appliances, fixtures and home furnishings.




Once your account has been registered and a sign-on created you will instantly be able to see billing, payment, and water usage history. One more step will need to be taken to opt in to receiving e-bills.
