WATER AND SEWER RATE PUBLIC HEARING - JUNE 17, 2021

The Columbia City Council will hold a public hearing on June 17, 2021, at 6:15 pm via conference call to accept testimony about proposed adjustments to the current water and sewer rates. If approved, the new rates will take effect on June 26 and show up on the July 26 bills. The additional revenue will help pay for operation and maintenance costs associated with the utility systems, make annual debt payments, meet loan debt coverage requirements, and complete necessary capital improvements as outlined in the water and wastewater system master plans.

LIGHT TRESPASS

City Council recently amended Ordinance No. 517, the nuisance ordinance, adding Section 21, Light Trespass stating, no person shall allow light from their property, either by directed beam or intermittent flashing, to fall across their property line(s) onto an adjoining lot or onto an adjoining public right-of-way (R). Light trespass shall be determined by visual observation, observed at ground level at property line. If you have any questions or concerns, please contact City Hall.

During the month of April, we have completed 12 new written reports, and responded to the following calls: 1 assist fire, 4 animal complaints, 3 assist persons, 2 disturbances/fights, 1 domestic, 3 cold frauds, 11 follow ups, 3 motorist assists, 4 parking complaints, 38 premise checks, 7 traffic stops, 2 traffic complaints, 2 suspicious circumstances, 4 suspicious persons, 3 welfare checks, 1 suicide threat, 35 vacation checks; all in support of the agency's community policing programs and initiatives. In total we handled 129 activities for the month of April, 2021.

- ✓ Batteries only car, rechargeable, button no alkaline batteries
- ✓ Gasoline/diesel/fuels
- ✓ Cleaners/detergents
- ✓ Poisons
- √ Fireworks/flares
- ✓ Ammunition
- ✓ Items containing mercury
- ✓ Propane cylinders
- ✓ Compressed gas cylinders

Items **NOT** accepted during the event:

- Garbage or trash
- Unwanted/unused prescriptions or over the counter medicines
- Liquid in containers larger than 5 gallons
