SERGEANTS CORNER

Criminal Activity. In the recent weeks we have been seeing more reports of theft occurring in our surrounding area. Please help reduce the chances of this happening in our city by making a few simple improvements to your yard. Cut back any bushes that can be used as concealment by a criminal on your property. Add lighting so people can see if someone is in your yard. Secure all your



belongings and do not leave items of value outside, in your vehicle, boat or RV. Keep an eye on your neighborhood while you're out walking. If we all stay vigilant we can make a difference and reduce crime in our City.

During the month of July we completed 7 new written reports and responded to the following calls: 1 audible alarm, 2 animal complaints, 1 assist outside agency, 2 assist persons,1 cold burglary, 10 civil calls, 2 civil enforcements, disturbance/fight, 1 DUII, 12 follow up calls, 1 hazard, 1 juvenile custody dispute, 1 juvenile runaway, 1 ordinance violation, 1 overdose, 2 parking complaints, 92 premise checks, 1 prowler, 7 suspicious circumstances, 7 suspicious persons, 1 suspicious vehicle, 1 suicide attempt, 3 suicide threats, 1 adult sex crime, 5 cold thefts, 1 trespass and 18 traffic stops, In total we handled 194 activities for the month of July, 2021.


PLANNING COMMISSION VACANCY




On sale for 5 are the nautical flag white t-shirts in S and XL only.

We have three different reading levels of the book. We have *Hidden Figures* books to check out, and books to take and pass along. We also have a wide range of related books to check out. The Scappoose Public Library received a national grant for small and rural libraries from the American Library Association to help fund the book purchases and activities.
