
BUDGET COMMITTEE VACANCY



GOLD STAR MARKER



In June of 2022, the idea of having Highway 30 in Oregon be dedicated as part of the National Gold Star Highway was presented to the Oregon State Federation of Garden Clubs, Inc.

On August 29, 2023, a Gold Star Marker was dedicated at Ontario, Oregon and on November 11, 2023 there will be a Marker dedicated at the terminus of Highway 30 in the Astoria area. This will allow Highway 30 to become a completed portion on the National Gold Star Memorial Highway.

With the Veterans Memorial Park in Columbia City overlooking Highway 30, it was fitting to seek approval of the City Council to place a Gold Star Family Marker at the park. The marker costs

approximately \$2,500 including manufacturing, shipping, installation and landscaping. The St. Helens Garden Club has already received some funds from individuals, and we will be seeking additional funds from businesses and individuals in the South Columbia County area.

Gold Star families are those who have lost a family member in military service to our country and there are several located here locally.

We invite members of our local community to join us by donating to make this special tribute a reality. If we raise the needed funds before January 1, 2024, the order can be placed before the costs increase.

You can donate by sending a check payable to St. Helens Garden Club and mail to PO Box 933, St. Helens OR 97051-0933, please indicate Gold Star Marker on the subject line. If giving a cash donation, please place it in an envelope with your mailing address and place it in the donation jar at City Hall in Columbia City at 1840 Second Street. The St. Helens Garden Club is a 501(C)(3) not for profit organization. Donator's of \$500 or more will have their names engraved on the marker.


