#### CHIEFS CORNER

Fireworks. We all know fireworks are fun, but they are also very dangerous. Last year we had a few incidents that caused small fires from fireworks. With the anticipation of dryer than normal weather for the summer, we expect the hazards to be even worse this year than last. Oregon has strict regulations on fireworks. The only legal fireworks are the ones purchased here in Oregon. They must be Oregon consumer legal fireworks, such as novelty devices, fountains, flitter sparklers, wheels, smoke devices and ground spinners. Please do not bring out of state fireworks here to light off, it will not be legal to do so. Fireworks that fly in the air, explode, or behave in an uncontrolled and unpredictable manner are not allowed in Oregon. Columbia City will have an Officer on duty July 4<sup>th</sup> to help monitor the use of fireworks. We encourage all our residents to participate in the celebration of our independence in a safe and responsible manner.

The Police Department serviced the following calls during April 2024: 2 audible alarms, 1 panic alarm, 4 animal complaints, 2 agency assists, 3 assist persons, 1 behavioral health, 4 civil calls, 3 civil enforcements, 1 assist fire/CPR, 2 DHS referrals, 1 domestic fight, 9 follow ups, 1 cold fraud, 2 harassment/threats, 1 hazard, 3 incomplete 911 calls, 1 juvenile runaway, 1 motorist assist, 2 missing persons, 2 ordinance violations, 1 parking complaint, 104 premise checks, 3 suspicious circumstances, 2 suspicious persons, 4 suspicious vehicles, 2 out with suspects, 1 cold theft, 3 traffic complaints, 26 traffic stops and 1 unwanted. In all the Police Department serviced 204 activities.

MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL CANDIDATE **FILING DATES** 

Three City Council positions (one for Mayor and two for City Councilor) will be filled by the voters during the November 5, 2024, General Election. Qualified electors who have resided within the City since November 5, 2023, may run for office. Nominating petitions are currently available at City Hall. The nominating petitions must be signed by 20 qualified electors, and candidates must submit the signature sheets to the Administrator/Recorder for verification allowing sufficient time for the verification process to be completed prior to the August 27, 2024, filing deadline. The positions are for a term of four years.
